We are grateful for yet another year of journeying alongside the lives of children and adults with disabilities. This report is a testament to the support received from our friends and partners, enabling the team to serve with joy.

The Anugrah program, based at Herbertpur, Uttarakhand, has been evolving to provide community-based rehabilitation services to children and adults with disabilities since 2002. These numbers and narratives give a glimpse of our services for the year 2024.

Learning centers

(Community
Based Centers
that provide
holistic rehab)

- 124 children with developmental disabilities have received daily physical therapy, occupational therapy and special education.
- 72 individuals with disabilities have received rehabilitative support through the home-based program.
- 25 children under six years of age, received services through the biweekly specialized early intervention and autism groups.
- 20 children with disabilities at Saharanpur Learning Centre received a comprehensive evaluation of eye vision and 5 children with disabilities were prescribed glasses for the first time.
- Out-patient services were provided to 210 new and 115 follow-up children and adults with disabilities.

Assistive devices

- The prosthetics and orthotics team were able to fabricate various devices (AFO KAFOs, prosthetic limbs, braces, hand splints, gaiters and adaptations) and reach out to 275 individuals this year.
- The Carpentry team were able to design devices such as CP postural chairs, standing frames, corner stools, parallel bars, and cognitive toys alongside commercial products for homes and offices.
- 35 individuals were provided appropriate wheelchairs based on their postural and functional requirements.
- 168 individuals were part of the 'Wheels For The World' Wheelchair distribution camp.

Training

- 29 students have been part of the CBID training and would be appearing for exams in January 2025.
- Skill training programs for young adults with developmental disabilities have been explored and we look forward to possible training avenues.
- Developing a new learning curriculum to integrate children into mainstream schools is under process.
- The CBR team has been undergoing ongoing trainings as part of capacity building.

Community mobilization

- The existing 2 DPOs carried out various activities to promote selfadvocacy. A new DPG in Selaqui was formed this year.
- School awarenesses were done to promote inclusion in 18 schools reaching out to about 700 children.
- Special Friends Club a platform to remove early attitudinal barriers was formed in 6 schools this year.
- The disability day rally on the 3rd of December attracted more than 4000 participants to walk and raise slogans promoting inclusion.
- Local stakeholders of the program were facilitated and informed about the various activities of the program.
- 2 families were supported in initiating disability-inclusive livelihood through electric rickshaws.
- Ongoing therapeutic support has been provided at the state-run home for destitute women (Nari Niketan)

Recreation Respite and Leisure

- The much-awaited Annual picnic had 67 children make the most of enjoying rides in a nearby amusement park.
- The annual sports witnessed 77 children displaying their competitive spirit to go beyond the expectations of just participating.
- 31 families were part of a 3-day annual family retreat to provide and experience a time of fun, respite, fellowship.
- Children from all the learning centers actively participated displaying a range of cultural programs during the annual program.

Team updates

We were blessed with 48 people on the team this year
